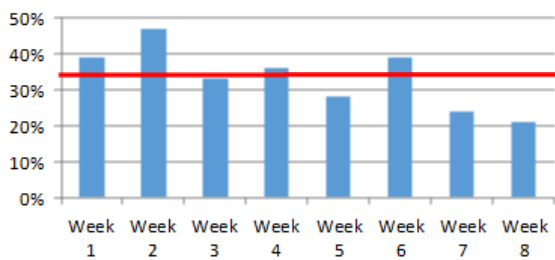

## Congratulations to the GSF Accredited Hospital Wards!

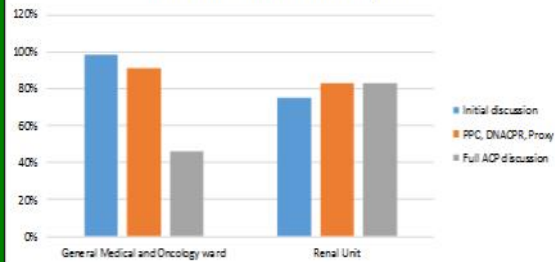

- Personalised care plans in final days.
- Support for families/carers enhanced.

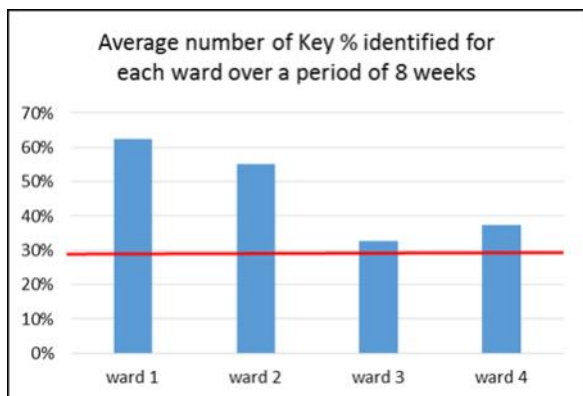

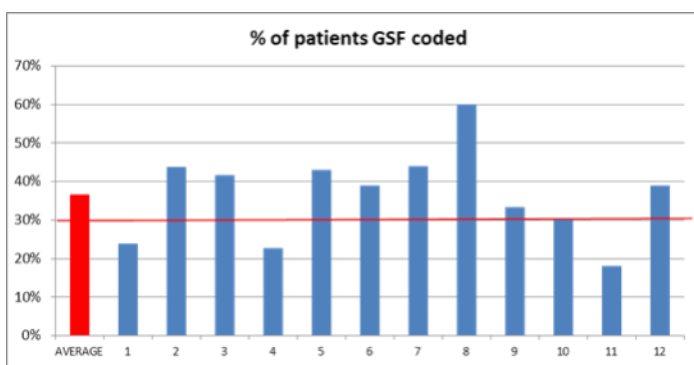


**Note average of 31% - 66% of patients identified to be in last year of life in Round 3 Community Hospitals**

### Key Achievements

42 Community Hospitals in 3 areas have undertaken the GSF Community Hospitals programme

Accredited Hospitals have:

- Increased the number of patients identified in their last year of life above 30% average
- Needs based coding and use of Core Care Plan
- Offering of Advance Care Planning discussions for all relevant patients
- Improved communication to GPs and community
- Development of hospital protocol to enable sustained long term quality improvement in all areas
